



## Quick Reference Sheet for the COVID-19 Vaccine Clinic

### Songhees Members and Songhees Community Members Who Live On- Reserve

1. Question: Who can receive a vaccine on Monday, March 8 and Tuesday, March 9?

Answer:

Those who meet these guidelines set by the province outlined below are eligible to receive a vaccine on Monday, March 8, and Tuesday, March 9:

- i. You are a Songhees Nation member who lives On-Reserve and is 18 years older
- You are the spouse of a Songhees Nation member and you both live On-Reserve and are over the age of 18
- You are a Songhees Nation Community Member who lives on the reserve with a Songhees Nation member and is over the age of 18

2. Question: I fit the guidelines listed above; when can I get my vaccine?

Answer:

Monday, March 8, 2021: 10:00 am – 6:00 pm

- If you meet the guidelines listed above and you are 60 years and over, your time slot is from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm on Monday, March 8, 2021.
- If you meet the guidelines listed above and you are 55 and over, your time slot is from 1:00 pm to 6:00 pm on Monday, March 8, 2021.

Tuesday, March 9, 2021: 10:00 am – 6:00 pm

- If you meet the guidelines listed above and you are 50 and over, your time slot is 10:00 am to 1:00 pm on Tuesday, March 9, 2021.
- If you meet the guidelines listed above and you are 18 and over, your time slot is 1:00 pm to 6:00 pm on Tuesday, March 9, 2021.

3. Question: What should I bring with me, when I go to get my vaccine?

Answer:

- Your personal health number (PHN, Care Card#)
- Your Status Number or Card
- Please wear a mask

4. Question: Where will the clinic be hosted?

Answer:

The vaccine clinic will take place at the Songhees Longhouse located at 200 Maplebank Road. It is a drive thru clinic. Please wear your mask.
